
# Lump sum funding in Horizon Europe



## Lump sum calls

Number and indicative budget of topics using lump sum funding published in the Horizon Europe work programmes (2021-2024)

- Stepwise phasing under HE: low volume in 2021 and 2022; first significant wave in 2023 and 2024
- Most of lump sum topics are under Pillar 2 (thematic clusters)



## Lump sums grants (end 2023)

- More than 5000 eligible proposals received
- More than 1300 grants signed
- More than 400 projects completed

 Lump sums are used mostly for small or mid-sized grants (figures for 2023 and 2024 budget, without EIC)






## Lump sums – updates (I)

#### **Issues raised by the NCPs**

 Horizon dashboard for lump sum evaluations: clearer guidance on purpose and use





#### Recent developments by the EC

- Updated dashboard landing page: to highlight that the dashboard provides an orientation of what normal personnel costs per month are in Horizon Europe
- Updated briefing for experts: experts must use the personnel cost dashboard & must document the assessment of the budget
- The series of lump sum videos was completed: the third video on the use of personnel costs dashboard was published in February

## Lump sums – updates (II)

#### Issues raised by the NCPs

- Detailed budget table (Excel template): clearer instructions on what costs to justify and what level of detail
- Reporting periods: guidance on the number and length of reporting periods



 Budget cuts after evaluation: actions to minimise this risk

 Technical reviews: clear instructions on what will be audited

#### Recent developments by the EC

- Updated instructions for the budget table: added more information and the link to the personnel costs dashboard
- Updated corporate guidance: additional information on completion of work packages, reporting periods, use of the personnel costs dashboard
- Updated corporate guidance: to ensure that applicants provide the right level of explanations, and that experts and EC officers evaluate this information comprehensively.
- Preparations for ex-post technical reviews are ongoing; no financial audits of lump sum grants

## **Lump sums – lessons learned exercise**

#### Lump sums are still (relatively) new

- Learning curve not yet completed (inside and outside the Commission)
- Some concerns persist
- We monitor the system and improve it if needed
- First assessment (2021) was positive, but few lump sum grants had been completed
- Second assessment (2024) will draw on a much bigger pool of proposals and grants
- Follow-up of ECA's recommendations (ECA Annual Report 2022) is ongoing




## Positive feedback in recent surveys

## Lump sum surveys in Q4 2023

- Nearly 14,000 lump sum participants and more than 1,000 experts
- Good response rates; overall feedback clearly positive
- 2<sup>nd</sup> lump sum
  assessment report
  expected in Q2 2024
